Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you have had a restful Easter break. We look forward to an exciting and busy Summer Term. Our topic for this half term is 'Plants' followed by 'Animals, including Humans'.

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Maths	During this term, the children will engage in a variety of mathematical concepts
	including: multiplying by 10, finding fractions of an amount, division,
	multiplication, telling the time (analogue and digital) and decimals.
	It is essential that the children are fluent with their times tables 2,3,4,5 & 8 by
	the end of the year.
	Daily, children will complete an early morning task to recap on learning from
	the year.
English	The children will be learning about poetry, play scripts, persuasive writing,
	limericks, narrative story writing and a newspaper report throughout this term.
	Children will continue to take part in guided reading every afternoon. We are
	working towards achieving a love of reading in our classes and children will be
	exposed to a variety of texts. Please continue to read with your child at home
	every day. Spelling words will go home on Fridays and the children will have a
	spelling test on Fridays. Please help your child to learn their spellings at home to
	ensure ultimate success.
Science	The first part of our term is learning about plants. Children will plan and carry
	out an experiment to determine what plants need in order to grow and survive.
	The second part of the term is learning about animals, including humans. The
	children will learn about the skeleton and muscular structure of the human body
	and learn about the correct form of nutrition which animals require.
Art	The children will perform close observations sketching of plants and then move
741	onto using watercolours in their work. They will take part in a study of the artist
	Van Gogh. In the second part of the term, the children will study and recreate
	the work of Andy Goldsworthy.
DT	We will be planning, designing and producing our own miniature green houses.
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Computing	Children will be learning how to send an email safely and plan and complete a
	survey.
PE	Children will learn to play cricket during the first part of the term and then
	move onto athletics during the second part. PE will be linked to our science topic
	on animals including humans. Opportunities for orienteering will be provided
	whenever possible.
SMSC	We will be working on developing relationships and how our bodies change as
	we become older.

RE	Children will be learning about religious codes of conduct, rules for living and
	exploring places of worship.
French	Children will continue to develop their vocabulary acquired this year. This
	includes responding to classroom instructions, listening and repeating stories and
	responding in French in a variety of topics.

<u>PE</u>- Please be reminded that children will need a P.E. Kit in school at all times. This should be black shorts, a plain white t-shirt and plimsolls. Please ensure all items are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Home Learning- A piece of homework will be set fortnightly linked to their English and Maths. Please encourage your child to complete their homework. Children also have access to Purple Mash, Education City and Mathletics which they can use anytime.
