Children will be using a variety of software programmes learning how to develop independence with interacting with IPads, bee-bots and remote-control cars.				
Expressive Arts and Desigh	Engaging with role play through the home corner and own interests. Learning new songs and rhymes. Beginning to move rhythmically to move through dance. Explore how to mix colours and how to design and create using own ideas with junk modelling.
