THE KING OF ALL DISCOVERIES!

The body of Egyptian boy king, Tutankhamen, has been found. In the early hours of yesterday morning, a number of local archeologists reported watching Howard Carter (a renowned Egyptologist) making the exciting find. Although exact details are yet to be released, it is thought that there are over a thousand artifacts in the tomb, along with the pharaoh's body.

Late last year, it was reported that Carter and his team, which includes Englishman Lord
Carnarvon, had begun excavation works on what they believed to be the tomb of the famous 'King Tut'. At the time, Carter, who had been using a chisel given to him by his grandmother on his 17th birthday, revealed what he had seen through a tiny hole in the doorway of the tomb. When asked if he could see anything, Carter replied: "Yes, wonderful things!"

With yesterday's new find, and the tomb now being totally uncovered, a source close to Carter told us:

"This is an important discovery – the world has never seen an archaeological find on this scale before, and I think it is unlikely that there ever will be again. It is simply magical – there are bows and arrows, wine, food and treasure and the body of the great Egyptian King, Tutankhamen, in a solid gold coffin!"

Tutankhamen was an Egyptian pharaoh who ruled from 1332 B.C. — when he was just 9 years old. Nobody knows how he died, which means that Carter's findings are even more important to historians today. It will help us to discover much more about the past.

While we wait for details of the contents of the tomb, rumours are spreading about the 'Curse of the Pharaohs' — it has been hinted by many that all who enter the tomb of a pharaoh will die early. One local Egyptian spoke of curse to The Daily News today:

"I think he must be very brave to enter the tomb – everybody around here has heard the story of the dreaded curse. People must be careful and let the gods lay in rest."
