asked Amy to stand too, to let the old people have their seats.

It was a hot day, Ellie and Matilda went to the shop to buy an ice-cream each. They both		
wanted chocolate, but there was only one chocolate ice-cream left, but there were lots of		
vanilla ice-creams. Matilda took the chocolate ice-cream saying she was the oldest so she		
should have the one she wanted. Was this a fair thing to do?
