

Dear Parents/Carers,

As part of our standards cup, children will help their class to earn points by completing their homework. The best way to help their class earn the points is to do their daily reading and spelling/times tables practise. In addition, children can select from a variety of other activities from the table below. These activities will be due by the end of the half term. The children are expected to complete at least 3 of these activities per half term but may complete more if they choose.

Children are also able to log into Education City and Purple Mash on a daily basis.

<b>Activity 1</b> Read the story of The Hare and the Tortoise and write a short after-race interview in the form of a playscript (2 sheets).	<b>Activity 2</b> Have fun writing a new rhyme based on the same pattern a 'Twinkle, twinkle, little star', eg. 'Wriggle, wriggle little worm'.
<b>Activity 3</b> Write a short description of their favourite thing to do in the summer holidays. Note that someone else will be reading their writing so they need to check for sense and handwriting.	<b>Activity 4</b> Write times as digital clock times using a 12-hour clock for favourite TV programmes.
<b>Activity 5</b> Practise multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100	<b>Activity 6</b> Give a use for each of the following metals and give a reason why it is suited to that use. • Aluminium • Iron • Copper
<b>Activity 7</b> <b>Do the research and answer the following questions:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Which is the rarest type of rock? Why is it rare?</li> <li>How many different types of sedimentary rock are there in the UK? How many in the world?</li> </ul>	<b>Activity 8</b> Make a salad or a healthy snack with your parents . Write your recipe neatly and tell the nutrients contents of your ingredients.
<b>Activity 9</b> Write an email to your teacher and inform her about your memories of Year 3? What did you enjoy the most in Year 3?	<b>Activity 10</b> Create your own one outdoor and one indoor game and write its instructions.
