Go on a counting walk! On your way to school can you spot and count 3 trees, 3 cars, 3 people, 3 houses, 3 birds? Remember to use your fingers to help you count the number of objects you spot as you go along. 	Favourite Story Bring a book into class to share with your class. What is your story called? What is it about? Where is your story set? Who are the characters? Can you draw your story? 	Go on an Autumn hunt! What signs of Autumn can you find? Talk about the colours of the leaves. Compare colours and textures. Why do they fall? Can you see more spider's webs? What is the weather like? 	Now and Then Look at a photo of you as a baby, how have you changed? What can you do now that you couldn't do then? Talk about the changes. Bring in a photograph of you as a baby for our class display. 
Gaining independence Can you put on your own coat? Do you know the coat trick? Practise together at home. 	Let's get physical Can you catch a large ball? Can you kick a ball? Can you ride a scooter or ride a balance bike? Visit your local park to engage with play equipment this will help improve large muscles movement. 	Nursery Rhymes What is your favourite nursery rhyme, can you remember all the words and sing it together at home? Don't forget to use actions as you recite the rhyme. 	Let's do some cutting! You could cut out some pictures you like from a magazine or comic. You could cut up different textures, salad or herbs, tin foil, material, paper towel. Remember to keep your thumb at the top and ask an adult to supervise!
