



Dear Parents/Carers,

The homework activities we now set will be more about spending time together as a family. You may decide to take some photos of the activities you do and upload them onto the Google Classroom under the 'Homework' section or to stick the photos in their homework books. Other tasks can be brought into school as they are completed to share with the class. **These activities will be due at the end of the half term.** The children are expected to **complete at least 3 of these activities per half term** but may complete more if they choose.

Children are also able to log into Education City, Epic and Purple Mash on a daily basis.

<u>Activity 1</u> Write a report about an animal that would have lived in the Stone Age.	<u>Activity 2</u> Make a model of a Stone Age house/dwelling.
<u>Activity 3</u> Use your knowledge of light, reflection and shadows to create a quiz for a friend or family member! You should ask between 5 and 10 questions. Make sure you also make an answer sheet! You might choose to write your quiz on paper, or you could use a computer. Why not add pictures? You could draw them yourself or find images using the computer.	<u>Activity 4</u> Write a diary entry from the perspective of Stone Age Boy.
<u>Activity 5</u> Make a Stone Age necklace.	<u>Activity 6</u> Create a cave painting.
<u>Activity 7</u> Read a book and write a detailed book review. Give a short summary of the story and characters. Remember to give the ratings.	<u>Activity 8</u> Write ten sentences neatly using expanded noun phrases.
<u>Activity 9</u> Make 3or 4 Place Value Riddles. For example: What is the number? What is the number? What is the number? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The number has three digits. • The ones digit is double 4. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The hundreds digit is an even number bigger than 5 but smaller than 7. • The tens digit is half the ones digit. 	<u>Activity 10</u> Be creative! Can you come up with your own piece of homework based on something you have been learning at school?
