As part of our standards cup, children will help their class to earn points by completing their homework. The best way to help their class earn the points is to do their daily reading and spelling/times tables practice. In addition, children can select from a variety of other activities from the table below. These activities will be due by the end of the half term. The children are expected to complete at least 3 of these activities per half term but may complete more if they choose.

Children are also able to log into Education City and Purple Mash daily.

## Activity 5

Carry out research to identify all the different things which plants need to grow and live/survive. You can present your information in any way, e.g. a poster, booklet, or fact sheet.

## Activity 7

Bake a cake or make a healthy sandwich and write the instuctions.

## Activity 9

Practise your throwing, catching, skipping, dancing, hula hooping and kicking skills. How many can you do in 1 minute? How many can you do in 2 minutes? Can you challenge other members of your family? Can you create a chart to show this information?

## Activity 2 Follow the steps <br> - Think of a number between 1 and 20 - Multiply it by 5 • Add five • Double it • Remove the last digit • Subtract one. What do you notice? 1. Ask as many different people as you can to think of a number. 2. Tell them every step in order up to and <br>  including step 4. 3. How detailed can you be when drawing and labelling the other parts? Can you name the parts inside the actual flower? Write the functions of the different parts of the flowering plant. <br> Activity 8 <br> Draw and colour a picture of an Anglo-Saxon. What are they wearing? (You will need to research this first). <br> Activity 10 <br> Not again! Write a short letter to persuade parents/carers to ban 'a food' children dislike from the house.
